 We need to acquit the \$5,000 Canada Bay Council for mental wellness activities by end April 2022 – what can we use this for reasonably quickly? We have \$5,000 for parent/community mental wellness activities \$4,000 Canada Bay Club grant was used toward a \$5,500 outdoor table tennis table – can we get some pics to send them, bring them in for a game? Can we please get some pics of the BBQ so we can acquit that grant, until we acquit we need to wait for the next \$20k for the outdoor table tennis tables For the past 2 years the P&C has been highlighting Sporting and Arts grants available of up to \$300,000. These grants come up every 6 months. Is there a plan for arts and sporting infrastructure at the school so we can apply for these funds?
